

London Calling is a quick knit and fun knit, it is simple and yet effective. The body is reminiscent of the rains drops expected of London and the edging was inspired by the gothic arches found in Castles, Cathedrals and Ruins found in the UK.

Materials:

1,5 skeins of Nurturing Fibres Soft Spun Worsted (100% Merino) 100g = 170m 5.5mm (US 9) needles

Stitch marker and a tapestry needle for sewing in the ends

Pattern notes:

Tension square before blocking: 2 inches x 2 inches = 8 stitches x 12 rows Remember to check that your tension square is correct. If your tension is too loose, then use a smaller needle. If your tension is too tight then try a bigger needle.

LETS GET KNITTING

THE SETUP

With 5.5mm needles, cast on 3 stitches.

Pick up 3sts on the selvedge and 3sts on the cast on edge and k all 9.

STITCH COUNT: 9 stitches

THE BODY

Row 1: K2, YO, P to last 2, YOB, K2.

Row 2: K2, YO, K2, KFB, place marker, KFB, knit to last 2 stitches, YO, K2.

Row 3: and every alternate row: K2, YO, P to last 2, YOB, K2.

Row 4: K2, YO, K to 1 stitch before the marker, KFB, SM, KFB, K to last 2 stitches, YO, K2 [21 stiches]

Row 6: K2, YO, K3, k1b, YO, k1b, K3, KFB, SM, KFB, K4, k1b, YO, k1b, K3, YO, K2

Row 8: K2, YO, K5, k1b, K1, k1b, K4, KFB, SM, KFB, K5, k1b, K1, k1b, K5, YO, K2

ROW 10: K2, YO, K7, k1b, K1, k1b, K5, KFB, SM, KFB, K6, k1b, K1, k1b, K7, YO, K2

ROW 12: K2, YO, K9, k1b, D1, k1b, K6, KFB, SM, KFB, K7, k1b, D1, k1b, K9, YO, K2

ROW 14: K2, YO, K to 1 stitch before the marker, KFB, SM, KFB, K to last 2 stitches, YO, K2 [51 stitches]

RAIN DROPS

ROW 16: K2, YO, K7, k1b, YO, k1b, K10, k1b, YO, k1b, K2, KFB, SM, KFB, K3, k1b, YO, k1b, K10, k1b, YO, k1b, K7, YO, K2

ROW 18: K2, YO, K9, k1b, K1, k1b, K10, k1b, K1, k1b, K3, KFB, SM, KFB, K4, k1b, K1, k1b, K10, k1b, K1, k1b, K9, YO, K2



THE GOTHIC ARCHES

ROW 66: K2, YO, K4, [YO, K5, k2tog, K5]x7, YO, K5, k2tog, K3, KFB, SM, KFB, K4, k2tog, k5, YO, [K5, k2tog, K5, YO]x7, K4, YO, K2 ROW 68: K2, YO, K2, [K4, YO, K1, YO, K4, SLK2P,]x8, K3, KFB, SM, KFB, [K4, SLK2P, K4, YO, K1, YO]x8, K6, YO, K2

ROW 70: K2, YO, [K2, SLK2P, K3, (YO, K1)x4]x8, K2, SLK2P, K3, YO, K1, YO, SM, (K1, YO)x2, K3, [SLK2P, K3, (YO, k1)x4, k2]x8, SLK2P, k2, YO, K2 [249 st] ROW 72: K2, YO, K2, [K1, SLK2P, K2, (YO, K1)x8]x8, K1, SLK2P, K2, [YO, K1]x3, YO, SM, (K1, YO)x4, K2, [SLK2P, K2, (YO, K1)x8, K1]x8, SLK2P, K3, YO, K2 [351 sts]

ROW 74: K2, YO, K4, [SLK2P, K17]x17, SLK2P, K4, YO, K2

Row 75: Cast off **very** loosely – I used a 7mm [US 10.5] needle!

Break yarn and sew in ends. Wet shawl and block.

ABREVIATIONS:

K: Knit P: Purl

KFB: Knit into the front and back of the stitch

PFB: Purl front and back

SM: Slip marker

K1b: Knit one through the back loop

D1: drop 1 stitch YO: Yarn over

SLK2P: slip 1stitch, K2 together, pass slipped stitch over the 2 knitted together. [3 stitches become 1] SLP2P: slip 1stitch, K2 together, pass slipped stitch over the 2 purled together. [3 stitches become 1]

YOB: Bring yarn through between the needles, then over the top of the right needle and back under the work to K2.

On the next row knit the YOB TBL to open up the YO.
