Nurturing Fibres Eco-Fusion

10 balls of 125m/50g in

Aventurine

Hook: 3.75mm

Tapestry Needle

Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

3trtog – three trebles together

beg – beg/inning

ch – chain

cluster – 3trtog

dc – double crochet

rep – repeat

sk – skip

tch – turning chain

tr – treble

IMPORTANT!

PATTERN NOTES

- Pattern is written in UK terminology
- Ch3 at the beginning of rows count as 1 tr.
- To increase the length, work more repeats of row 2 – 7. (If you do this, remember to buy extra yarn.)
- To decrease the length, work fewer repeats of row 2 – 7.
- To increase the width of the sarong, add multiples of 19 chains. (If you do this, remember to buy extra yarn.)
- To decrease the width of the sarong, decrease in multiples of 19.

INSTRUCTIONS



Using a 3.75mm hook, loosely make 254 ch.

Row 1: 1dc in the 2nd ch from hook, *ch5, sk next 4 ch, 1dc in next ch, ch2, sk next 2 ch, (1cluster in the next ch, ch3, sk next ch) 4 times, 1cluster in the next ch, ch2, sk next 2 ch, 1dc in the next ch*, rep from * to last 5 ch, ch5, sk next 4 ch, 1dc in the last ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch3, 2tr in the base of the 3ch, *1dc in next 5chsp, ch5, sk next 2chsp, 1dc the next 3chsp, ch5, sk next 3chsp, 1dc in the next cluster, ch5, sk next 3chsp, 1dc in the next 3chsp, ch5, sk next 2chsp*, rep from * to last 5chsp, 1dc in last 5chsp, 3tr in last dc, turn.

Row 3: Ch3, (2tr in the next tr) twice, *1dc in the next 5chsp, ch5, 1dc in the next 5chsp, (1tr, ch3, 1tr) in the next dc, (1dc in the next 5chsp, ch5) twice*, rep from * to 2nd last rep, work last rep as follows: 1dc in the next 5chsp, ch5, 1dc in the next 5chsp, (1tr, ch3, 1tr) in the next dc, 1dc in the next 5chsp, ch5, 1dc in next 5chsp, (2tr in the next tr) twice, 1tr in the last tr, turn.

Row 4: Ch6 (count as 1tr, ch3), sk next tr, 1cluster in next tr, ch3, sk next tr, 1cluster in next tr, ch1, 1 dc in next 5chsp, *ch5, 1dc in next chsp*, rep from * across to last chsp, ch1, 1cluster in next tr, ch3, sk next tr, 1cluster in next tr, ch3, sk next tr, 1tr in last tr, turn.

(Note/Hint: there should be a dc in every 3chsp AND 5chsp, with 5ch between each)

Row 5: Ch1 (doesn't count as st), 1dc in same st, ch5, sk next 3chsp, 1dc in next 3chsp, *ch5, 1dc in next 5chsp, 5tr in next dc, 1dc in next 5chsp, (ch5, 1dc in next 5chsp) twice*, rep from * across row to 2nd last rep, working last rep as follows: *ch5, 1dc in next 5chsp, 5tr in next dc, 1dc in next 5chsp, ch5, 1dc in next 3chsp, ch5, 1dc in 3rd ch of tch, turn.

Row 6: Ch4 (count as tr and ch1), 1tr in the base of the ch4, *1dc in the next 5chsp, ch5, 1dc in the next 5chsp, (2tr in the next tr) twice, 1tr in the next tr, (2tr in the next tr) twice, 1dc in the next 5chsp, ch5*, rep from * across to last 5chsp, 1dc in the last 5chsp, (1tr, ch1, 1tr) in the last dc, turn.

Row 7: Ch1 (doesn't count as st), 1dc in same st, *ch5, 1dc in next 5chsp, ch1, (1cluster in next tr, ch3, sk next tr) 4 times, 1cluster in next tr, ch1, 1dc in next 5chsp* rep from * to last 5chsp, ch5, 1dc in 3rd ch of tch, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 – 7 another 14 times.

Next row: Rep row 2.

NURTURING FIBRES

Before starting the next row, use the other end on your ball of yarn. Join it at the end of the row, and ch 100. Fasten off. Return to the start of the row.

Next row: Ch101, make 1dc in second ch from hook, 1dc in each ch across to the body of the sarong, *1dc in each tr and dc, and 5dc in each 5chsp*, rep from * across to the 100ch, work 1dc in each ch, turn.

Next row: Ch1 (doesn't count as st), 1dc in each dc across. Fasten off.

OPTIONAL: Work 1 row of dc's across the bottom edge. Fasten off.

FINISH UP

Weave in all loose ends. Block according to measurements given.



ABOUT THE YARNS

Eco-Fusion is a uniquely spun yarn with 125 meters to a ball. It is 50% bamboo and 50% cotton & lovingly Hand dyed in South Africa.
