MATERIALS:

SuperTwist DK Vintage Palette

(100% Merino, DK / 8 ply, 50 grams)

SuperTwist DK 100g Main colour

SuperTwist Dk 50g Contrasting colour

4m needles [circular or DPNS]

Stitch marker

Tapestry needle for weaving in ends

TENSION SQUARE: If your tension is too loose, then use a smaller needle.

If your tension is too tight then try a bigger needle.

PATTERN NOTES:

When choosing your colours I have a few pointers

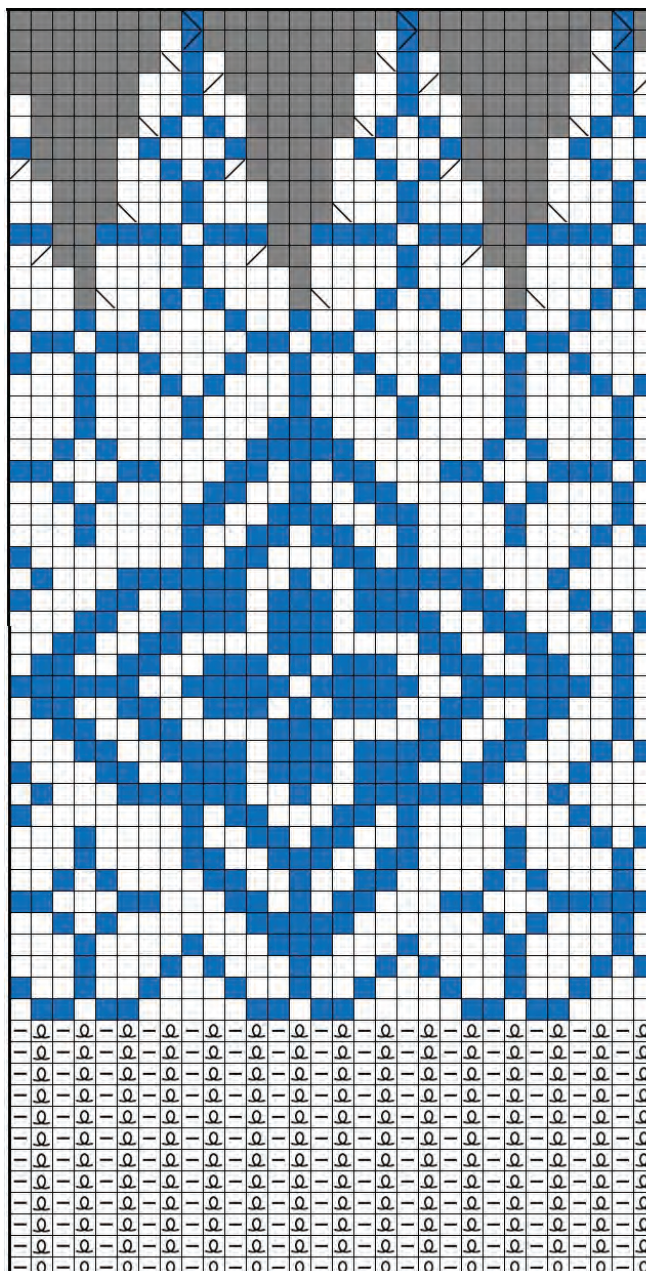
Main colour: It is best for the main colour to me a solid colourway

Feature colour: This can be a speckled colour, but ensure that the flecks do not resemble the main colour, as this will detract from the effect.

TO MAKE:

Cast on 120 sts. You can use any cast on, as long as it gives a neat edge and remains stretchy. Join in the round, making sure to not twist your stitches.

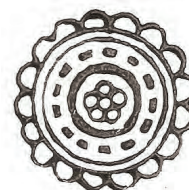
Follow the chart on page 2, starting from the bottom row. The rib is a twisted rib is knitted for 12 rows and is included in on the chart.



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Abbreviations

	Knit 2 together	0	Knit through the back loop
