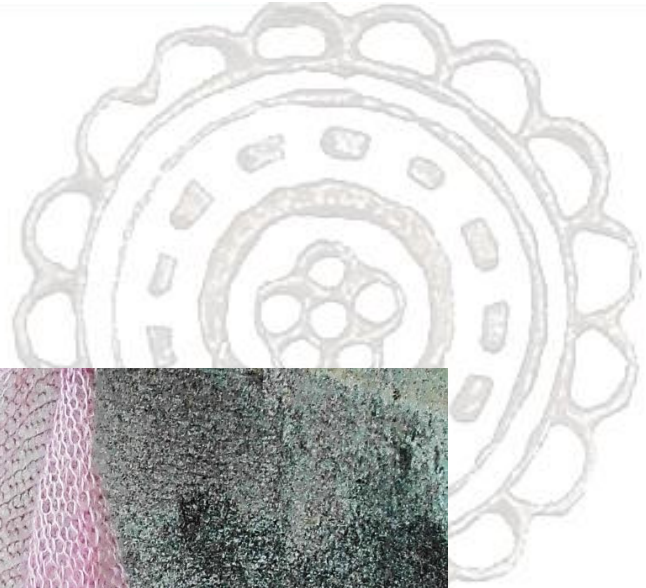

# NURTURING FIBRES

## PATTERN DIFFICULTY

Easy

## MEASUREMENTS

Width: 40cm

Length: 180cm

## MATERIALS

### Nurturing Fibres Kid Silk

2 balls of 200m/25g in  
Cherry Blossom

1 packet Miyuki Beads in  
Lilac

Needle: 5.5mm

Hook: 5.5mm

Beading hook: 0.5mm

Tapestry Needle

Scissors

## IMPORTANT! PATTERN NOTES

The body of the pattern is  
knitted.

The border is crocheted.

## ABBREVIATIONS

ch – chain

dc – double crochet

k – knit

m1 – make one

st/s – stitch/es



## INSTRUCTIONS

### BODY

Using 5.5mm Knitting  
needles, cast on 5 sts

**Row 1:** k

**Row 2:** k2, p1, k2

**Row 3:** k2, m1, k to end  
(6sts)

**Row 4:** k2, p to last 2 sts, k  
Repeat row 3 and 4 until you  
have 80 sts or have used  
45% of your yarn.

**Row 153:** k

**Row 154:** k2, p to last 2 sts,  
k2

**Row 155:** k

**Row 156:** k2, p to last 2 sts,  
k2

**Row 157:** k1, k2tog, k to end  
(79sts)

**Row 158:** k2, p to last 2 sts, k  
Repeat row 157 and 158 until  
you have 5 sts remaining.  
Knit one row and then cast  
off.

### BORDER

Change to the 5.5mm  
crochet hook and begin with  
the border.

Across the top of the shawl:  
Ch 3, \*dc1 ch1\* rep from \*  
until you reach the corner.  
(Make sure to add extra dc1,  
ch1 on the corners to  
accommodate the corner  
shaping)

2 Bottom edges of the  
shawl: Ch 3, \*dc1 ch, slip 2  
beads onto the ch st and dc\*  
rep from \* until you reach  
the triangular point of the  
shawl. (Make sure to add  
extra dc1, ch1 on the corner  
to accommodate the corner

shaping) \*dc1 ch, slip 2  
beads onto the ch st and dc\*  
rep from \* until you reach  
extra the end of the row  
(make sure to add extra dc1,  
ch1 on the corner to  
accommodate the corner  
shaping)

### FINISH UP

Weave in all remaining  
loose ends and block if  
necessary.

### ABOUT THE YARNS

KidSilk is a super soft and  
elegant yarn with 200  
meters to a ball. It is 70%  
mohair, 30% silk & is lovingly  
hand-dyed in South Africa.
