PATTERN DIFFICULTY

Easy

MEASUREMENTS

Pattern Sizes:

30 (32, 34, 36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46)

Completed measurements:

Bust:

85 (90, 94, 100, 104, 110, 114, 120, 124) cm

Length to shoulder:

54 (55, 56, 60, 60, 61, 66, 67, 67) cm

Sleeve length:

47 (47, 47, 48, 48, 48, 48, 50, 50) cm

MATERIALS

Nurturing Fibres Eco-Fusion

50g/125m:

2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3) x Charcoal

2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3) x

Cobblestone

3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4, 4, 4, 4) x Mist

1 (1, 1, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2) x Old Gold

4 (5, 5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 7) x Vanilla

Hook: 4.00mm

Tapestry Needle

Scissors

GAUGE

14sts x 11 rows = 10x10cm

when worked in htr's with a

4.00mm hook

ABBREVIATIONS

Beg - beginning

Ch/s - chain/s

Cont - continue

Dc - double crochet

Dec - decrease

Htr - half treble

Rep - repeat

RS - right side

Sk - skip

Slst - slip stitch

Sts - stitch/es

WS - wrong side

IMPORTANT! PATTERN NOTES

- All rows start with a ch1, but this doesn't count as a stitch.
- For a longer top, simply work more rows up to the armhole shaping, but keep in mind you might need more yarn.
- The cardigan is loose-fitting, with the back longer than the front.
- The sleeves are also longer than usual and can be folded over to create funky cuffs.
- Pattern is written in UK terminology.



PATTERN NOTES

Stripe Sequence:

Sizes 30, 32, 34:

10 rows in Charcoal (only 5 for the front)

10 rows in Mist

2 rows in Vanilla

7 rows in Old Gold

10 rows in Cobblestone

10 rows in Mist

7 rows in Vanilla

2 rows in Cobblestone

10 rows in Mist

2 rows in Vanilla

4 rows in Old Gold

3 rows in Mist

Sizes 36, 38, 40:

12 rows in Charcoal (only 6 for the front)

10 rows in Mist

2 rows in Vanilla

9 rows in Old Gold

10 rows in Cobblestone

10 rows in Mist

7 rows in Vanilla

2 rows in Cobblestone

10 rows in Mist

2 rows in Vanilla

4 rows in Old Gold

3 rows in Mist

Sizes 42, 44, 46:

12 rows in Charcoal (only 6 for the front)

12 rows in Mist

2 rows in Vanilla

11 rows in Old Gold

12 rows in Cobblestone

10 rows in Mist

7 rows in Vanilla

4 rows in Cobblestone

10 rows in Mist

2 rows in Vanilla

5 rows in Old Gold

3 rows in Mist

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INSTRUCTIONS

BACK

With a 4.00mm hook, make 78 (83, 88, 93, 98, 103, 108, 113, 118) ch and follow the stripe sequence as given under Pattern Notes.

Row 1: (RS) Insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, make 1htr, 1htr in each ch across, turn. (77 (82, 87, 92, 97, 102, 107, 112, 117) sts)

Next row: Ch1, 1htr in each htr across, turn.

Rep prev row until piece measures 52 (53, 54, 58, 58, 59, 64, 65, 65) cm

SHAPE SHOULDERS & NECKLINE

Next row: Work 1htr across the first 25 (27, 30, 31, 34, 36, 37, 39, 41) sts ONLY, turn.

Next row: Slst over the first st, and work 1htr in each st across, fasten off. 24 (26, 29, 30, 33, 35, 36, 38, 40) sts
Leave the middle 27 (28, 27, 30, 29, 30, 33, 34, 35) sts unworked. Re-join yarn in the next st and rep for second shoulder, leaving the last st off the last row at the neckline unworked. Fasten off.

FRONT

Work as for back until 6 rows remain, then:

SHAPE LEFT NECKLINE

Next row: Work across the next 29 (31, 34, 35, 38, 40, 41, 43, 45) htr, turn.

Next 5 rows: Work in pattern but dec one stitch at the neckline on EVERY row, by leaving it unworked. 24 (26, 29, 30, 33, 35, 36, 38, 40) sts.

SHAPE RIGHT NECKLINE

Leave the middle 19 (20, 19, 22, 21, 22, 25, 26, 27) sts unworked and work as for left side. 24 (26, 29, 30, 33, 35, 36, 38, 40) sts.

SLEEVES



Stripe sequence for all sizes:

10 rows in Charcoal
1 row in Vanilla
1 row in Old Gold
Rest of sleeve in Vanilla

With a 4.00mm hook, make 26 (29, 32, 33, 33, 34, 34, 35, 35) chs and work according to the stripe sequence given above.

Row 1: (RS) Insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, work 1htr, work 1htr in each ch across, turn. (25 (28, 31, 32, 32, 33, 33, 34, 34) htr)

Row 2: Ch1, 1htr in each htr across, turn.

Row 3: Rep row 2

Row 4: Inc 1 st at the beg and end of this and every 4th row a total of 13 (13, 13, 14, 14, 15, 15, 16, 15) times.

Cont straight without any further shaping until sleeve measures 47 (47, 47, 48, 48, 48, 48, 50, 50) cm or preferred length. (51 (54, 57, 60, 60, 63, 63, 63, 66, 66) sts) Fasten off.

INTERMEDIATE FINISH UP

With wrong sides facing, sew shoulder seams.

NECK EDGING

The neck edging is done in a technique called crochet ribbing.

With right side facing, join with Charcoal at the left shoulder seam. Ch6.

Insert hook in the 2nd ch from the hook and work 1dc in each of the next 5 chs. Slst across the last stitch of the next two rows and turn. Skip the slsts and work 1dc in the back loops of each dc across. Turn, ch1, work 1dc in the back loops of each of the 5dc's across, slst over the last st of the next two rows, turn. Continue working back and forth like this until the neck edging is complete for the entire neckline. Fasten off.

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FINISH UP

Weave in all remaining ends.
Fold sleeves in half lengthways, then placing folds on shoulder seams, sew sleeves in position, leaving the Charcoal section open. Sew up side and sleeve seams leaving slide slits on the side as per personal preference. Weave in all loose ends.
Block garment to measurement, cover with a damp cloth (or spray with water) and allow to dry.



ABOUT THE YARNS

Eco-Fusion is a uniquely spun yarn with 125 meters to a ball. It is 50% bamboo and 50% cotton and is lovingly hand-dyed in South Africa.
