MEASUREMENTS

Pattern Sizes:

One size

Completed measurements:

38cm (not including the crocheted tassels)

MATERIALS

Nurturing Fibres Eco-Lush

50g/200m

1x ball in Vanilla

1x ball in Ruby Pink

2x balls in Anvil

Hook: 4.00mm

Tapestry Needle

Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

2trtog – two treble together

3trtog – three treble together

ch/s – chain/s

chsp/s – chain space/s

dc – double crochet

htr – half treble

sk – skip

slst – slip stitch

st/s – stitch/es

tr – treble

IMPORTANT!

PATTERN NOTES

Pattern is written in UK terminology

The post of a stitch refers to the actual body of a stitch.

INSTRUCTIONS

BODY

With a 4.00mm hook, ch4

Row 1: Work 1tr in the 4th ch from hook, turn.

Row 2: Ch3, 1tr in next tr, turn.

Row 3: Ch3, 1tr at the base of the ch 3, 1tr in next tr, turn. (1st increased)

Row 4: Ch3, 1tr in next tr, 2tr in last tr, turn.

Row 5: Ch3, 1tr at the base of the ch 3, 1tr in each tr to end, turn.

Row 6: Ch3, 1tr in each tr to end, work 2tr in the last st, turn.

Row 7 – 20: Rep row 5 – 6. (20 sts)

Row 21: Ch3, 1tr in each tr across, turn.

Row 22: Ch3, work 1tr in each tr to end, work 2tr in the last st, turn.

Row 23 – 72: Rep row 21 – 22. (46 sts)

Row 73 – 88: Ch3, 1tr in each st across, turn.

Row 89: Ch2, 1tr in next tr (count as 2trtog), 1tr in each tr to end, turn.

Row 90: Ch3, 1tr in each tr, turn.

Row 91 – 132: Rep row 89 – 90. (24 sts)

Row 133: Ch2, 1tr in next tr (count as 2trtog), 1tr in each tr to end, turn.

Row 134: Ch3, 1tr in each tr to last two sts, 2trtog over last two sts, turn.

Row 135 – 158: Rep row 133 – 134.

Row 159: Ch2, 1tr in next tr (count as 2trtog), fasten off.

BORDER



For the next section, work across the curved edge (not the straight edge)

With Ruby Pink, insert hook in the point and work 2 htr in the same point. Work 1 htr in around the post of the first tr and continue working 2htr around the post of each st across the curved edge, ending with 2htr in the point at the end. Fasten off.

Using Vanilla, join yarn in the first st.

Row 1: Ch5 (count as a tr and ch2), 1tr at the base of the ch 5, *ch1, sk next st, 1tr in the next st*, rep from * across until 2 sts remain, ch1 (1tr, ch1, 1tr) in the last st, turn.

Row 2: Ch5. (count as a tr and ch2), 1tr in the first 1chsp, ch1, 1tr in the same 1chsp, *ch1, 1tr in the next 1chsp*, rep from * to the last 1chsp. (ch1, 1tr, ch1, 1tr, ch1) in the last chsp, 1tr in the 3rd ch, turn.

Row 3 – 6: Rep prev row.

Row 7: Ch1, 1dc in the same st, 2dc in the first 1chsp, *1dc in the next tr, 1dc in the next 1chsp*, rep from * to the last

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1chsp, 3dc in the last 1chsp,
1dc in the 3rd ch, turn.

Row 8: *Ch11, 3trtog in the 4th
ch from hook, ch3, sk next 3
ch, 1slst in the next ch, ch3, sk
next dc, 1dc in the next st, ch5,
sk next dc, 1dc in the next dc*,
rep from * all across to the last
2 sts, ch11, 3trtog in the 4th ch
from hook, ch3, sk next 3 ch,
1slst in the next ch, ch3, sk
next dc, 1dc in the last dc.
Fasten off.

FINISH UP

Weave in all loose ends and
block to measurement.

Eco-Lush is a uniquely spun
yarn with 200 meters to a ball.
It is 40% bamboo and 60%
cotton and is lovingly hand-
dyed in South Africa.
