Nurturing Fibres Eco-Cotton

125m/50g balls:

1x Sunkissed Coral

1x Aventurine

1x Cornflower

1x Sweet Pea

1x Lavender

1x Lime

1x Sunglow

5x Cobblestone

16x Karoolands

4.00mm hook

Tapestry Needle

Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

bp tr – back post treble

ch – chain

chsp – chain space

dc – double crochet

htr – half treble

rep – repeat

slst – slip stitch

sp – space

st-sp – stitch space

tr – treble

IMPORTANT! PATTERN NOTES AND SPECIAL STITCHES

- Pattern is written in UK terminology
- Work ch3 at the beginning of tr rounds. This counts as a stitch.
- If possible, a standing stitch at the beginning of rounds will give a much better appearance. YouTube has many excellent tutorials.

- The post of the stitch refers to the actual body of the stitch.
- Colour A will be:
 - Sunkissed Coral
 - Aventurine
 - Cornflower
 - Sweet Pea
 - Lavender
 - Lime
 - Sunglow
 - Karoolands
- For layout, please see graph at the end of the pattern.

Bptr: Yarn over, insert hook from back to front and back again around the post of the stitch indicated, work a treble as per usual.

INSTRUCTIONS



Make 10 blocks of each of colour A as stipulated *but* make 29 blocks in Karoolands. (99 blocks in total)

Instructions

Using colour A, ch4, close with a slst, OR make a magic ring.

Round 1: Work ch3, 2tr, ch2, (3tr, ch2) three times, close with a slst in the 3rd ch. (12tr's)

For the next two rounds, work the tr's in the space between the posts of the two tr's of the

previous round. It will be referred to as st-sp/s.

Round 2: Slst to the next 2chsp, and work (ch3, 1tr, ch2, 2tr) in the same sp, *1tr in the next 2 st-sps, **, (2tr, ch2, 2tr) in the next 2chsp,* rep from * all around, ending the last rep at **, close with a slst in the 3rd ch. (24tr's)

Round 3: Slst to the next 2chsp, and work (ch3, 1tr, ch2, 2tr) in the same sp, *1tr in the next 5 st-sps, **, (2tr, ch2, 2tr) in the next 2chsp,* rep from * all around, ending the last rep at **, close with a slst in the 3rd ch and fasten off. (36tr's)

Round 4: With Cobblestone, join yarn in any corner space. (Ch3, 1tr, ch1, 2tr) in the same sp, *1bp tr around the next 9 sts**, (2tr, ch1, 2tr) in the next 2chsp, rep from * all around, ending the last rep at **, close with a slst in the 3rd ch and fasten off. (36bp tr's, 16 tr's)

Round 5: With Karoolands, join yarn in any corner space. (Ch3, 1tr, ch1, 2tr) in the same sp, *1bp tr around the next 13 sts**, (2tr, ch1, 2tr) in the next 2chsp, rep from * all around, ending the last rep at **, close with a slst in the 3rd ch and fasten off. (52bp tr's, 16 tr's)

For the next round, work the tr's in the space between the posts of the two tr's of the previous round. It will be referred to as st-sp/s.

Round 6: Slst to the next 1chsp, and work (ch2, 1htr, ch1, 2htr) in the same sp, *1tr in the

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next 16 st-sps, **, (2htr, ch1, 2htr) in the next 1chsp,* rep from * all around, ending the last rep at **, close with a slst in the 3rd ch and fasten off. (64tr's, 16htr's)

FINISH UP

Weave in all loose ends and whipstitch the blocks together according to the graph.

BORDER

Round 1: With Karoolands, join yarn in any corner. Work (ch3, 1tr, ch2, 2tr) in the same sp, *1tr in each st-sp to next corner, **, (2tr, ch2, 2tr) in the next 2chsp,*

rep from * all around, ending the last rep at **, close with a slst in the 3rd ch.

Round 2: Slst to next 2chsp, (ch3, 1tr, ch2, 2tr) in the same sp, *1bptr around each of the following sts to the next corner **, (2tr, ch2, 2tr) in the next 2chsp, rep from * all around, ending the last rep at **, close with a slst in the 3rd ch and fasten off. Weave in remaining loose ends.

ABOUT THE YARNS

Eco-Cotton is a softly spun yarn with 125 meters to a ball.

It is 100% cotton and lovingly hand-dyed in South Africa.
