## **MEASUREMENTS**

Pattern Sizes:

Adjustable for a variety of devices

### MATERIALS

Nurturing Fibres 50g/125m Eco-Bamboo

1x Ruby Pink (colour A) 1x Orchid (colour B) 1x Lime (colour C) Hook: 3.50mm Tapestry Needle Scissors

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

2dccl - (2 double crochet cluster) \*Yarn over, insert hook into the indicated stitch, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops.\*\* Repeat from \*to \*\* one more time. Yarn over and pull through all three loops to complete the stitch

Ch - chain Dc - Double crochet Fpsc - front post single

crochet. Insert the hook from front to back to front around the indicated stitch and work a SC.

Fpdc - front post double crochet. Insert the hook from front to back to front around the indicated stitch and work a dc.

Sc - Single crochet Sl st - slip stitch

## IMPORTANT! PATTERN NOTES

Pattern is written in US terminology

#### INSTRUCTIONS

#### SQUARES

Round 1: (Colour A) In a magic ring work a ch2 and a dc (this counts as your first 2dccl), ch2. \*2dccl (see stitches), ch2\*\*. Repeat from \* to \*\* 6 more times. Join with a sl st to the first 2dccl. Cut yarn and sew ends. (8 2dccl. 8 ch2)









Round 2: (Colour B) Start with a standing dc in any ch2 space. Work 1 more dc, ch2, 2 dc in same space. This will be your first corner. \*Fpdc around next 2dccl. 2 dc in next ch2 space, fpdc around next 2dccl, (2 dc, ch2, 2dc) in next ch2 space.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* 3 more times, omitting last corner stitches. Join with a sl st to first dc. Cut yarn and sew ends. (24 dc, 8 fpdc, 4 ch2)













Round 3: (Colour A) Start with a standing sc in any ch2 corner space. Ch2, sc in same ch2 corner space. This will be your first corner. \*Sc in next 2 stitches, fpsc around fpdc from last round, sc in next 2 stitches, fpsc around fpdc from last round, sc in last 2 stitches. (Sc, ch2, sc) in next ch2 corner space.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* 3 more times, omitting last corner stitches. Join with a sl st to first sc. Cut yarn and sew ends. (32 sc, 8 fpsc, 4 ch2)





For my tablet size I needed 27 squares. I made them in two different colourways as shown in following pictures. You can make more squares according to your device sizes:





## JOINING THE SQUARES

Squares are joined with sc.

Vertical joining – Use colour C to join your squares. Hold 2 squares together (back to back). Catching loops from both squares start joining them with a \*sc in ch2 corner space. Sc in next 10 stitches and 1 sc in next ch2 corner space. Ch 2.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* omitting the last 2 ch. End each joining row with a ch to secure. Cut yarn.











Horizontal joining – Repeat what you made in the vertical joining. In this case the ch2 between squares overlaps ch2 of the vertical joining.





Now join the bottom, starting in the side bars of the last sc from vertical joining. Make a sc in every ch2 corner space, a sc in every stitch and a sc on top of the joining vertical lines.









Finally join the top part. Start joining the 3 squares, that will fold to close the pouch.

Continue with sc all over the top of the other 3 squares, that are the last ones of the front part of the pouch.







There are only the sides and top of the 3 squares, that consist in the fold part of the pouch, to finish. Do it with sc starting in the ch2 corner space of the right square. In both corners work 3 sc. Work

a sc in every stitch, a sc in every ch2 corner space from each square and a sc on top of the 2 joining vertical lines.





To close the pouch I added a button in the front part and a cord in the middle of the central square from the top 3. I just passed the cord through stitches leaving 2 stitches in between.









#### ABOUT THE YARNS

Eco-Bamboo is a luxurious yarn that shimmers and has a wonderful drape. This yarn has 125 meters to a ball. It is 100% bamboo and is lovingly hand-dyed in South Africa.
