Nurturing Fibres Eco-Fusion

125m/50g

2x Vanilla (c1)

1x Fawn (c2)

1x Seashell (c3)

2x Karoolands (c4)

Needles: 5.00mm (80cm)

circular needle

Tapestry Needle

Scissors

GAUGE

7sts x 8 rows in garter stitch =
4x4cm

ABBREVIATIONS

K – Knit

K2tog – Knit 2 together

Kb – knit in back

Kf – knit in front

Ktbl – Knit through back loop

P – Purl

RS – Right Side

St/s – stitch/es

SSK – Slip slip knit

Yf – Yarn forward

YO – Yarn Over

WS – Wrong Side

INSTRUCTIONS

SECTION 1

Cast on and Set up rows:

Using C1 (Vanilla), cast on 6
stitches.

Knit one row.

Row 1: (RS) k1, k2tog, knit to
last 2 sts, (kf, yo, kb), k1 –
increased 1 stitch.

Row 2: (WS) knit row.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until 76
stitches on needle.

SECTION 2

Use C2 (Fawn)

Row 1: (RS) k1, k2tog, knit to
last 2 sts, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 2: (WS) knit all even rows.

Row 3: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog
x 3, k6*, repeat to last 8 sts, k6,
(kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 5: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog
x 3, k6*, repeat to last 9 sts, yo,
k2tog x 3, k1, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 7: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog
x 3, k6*, repeat to last 10 sts,
yo, k2tog x 3, k2, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 9: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog
x 3, k6*, repeat to last 11 sts,
yo, k2tog x 3, k3, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 11: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 12
sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k4, (kf, yo,
kb), k1.

Row 13: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 13
sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k5, (kf, yo,
kb), k1.

Row 15: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 2
sts, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 17: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 3
sts, k1, (kf, yo, kb), k1

Row 19: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 4
sts, k2, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 21: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 5
sts, k3, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 23: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 6
sts, k4, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 25: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 7
sts, k5, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 27: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 8
sts, yo, k2tog x 3, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 29: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 9
sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k1, (kf, yo, kb),
k1

Row 31: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 10
sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k2, (kf, yo,
kb), k1.

Row 33: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 11
sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k3, (kf, yo,
kb), k1.

Row 35: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo,
k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 12

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sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k4, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 37: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 13 sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k5, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 39: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 2 sts, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 41: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 3 sts, k1, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 43: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 4 sts, k2, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 45: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 5 sts, k3, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 47: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 6 sts, k4, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 49: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 7 sts, k5, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 51: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 8 sts, k6, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 53: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6*, repeat to last 9 sts, yo, k2tog x 3, k1, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 55: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6* repeat to last 10 st, yo, k2tog x 3, k2, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 57: k1, k2tog, k6, *yo, k2tog x 3, k6* repeat to last 11 st, yo, k2tog x 3, k3, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Stitches increased to 105 sts.

SECTION 3:

Using C1 and C3 work alternate rows in each colour.

Row 1: C1 - (RS) k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 st, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 2: C1 - (WS) knit row.

Row 3: C3 - (RS) k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 st, (kf, yo, kb), k1 – increased 1 stitch.

Row 4: C3 - (WS) knit row.

Repeat these 4 rows 20 times.

SECTION 4:

Using C4

Row 1: (RS) k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 st, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 2: (WS) knit row.

Row 3: k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 st, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 4: k10, *yo, k2tog* 20 times, knit to end.

Row 5: (RS) k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 st, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 6: (WS) knit row.

Row 7: k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 st, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 8: k20, *yo, k2tog* 30 times, knit to end.

Repeat rows 1 – 8, 6 more times.

Row 48: k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 st, (kf, yo, kb), k1.

Row 49: (WS) knit row.

Repeat rows 48 and 49 once more.

Bind off using a stretchy bind off:

Purl 2 st together, place stitch from right needle back to left needle, purl 2 st together – continue until all

stitches have been worked off.



FINISH UP

Weave in ends. Soak shawl in lukewarm water in detergent for 20 minutes. Squeeze water out (do not wring the water from the shawl). Place the shawl on a flat surface to dry.

ABOUT THE YARNS

Eco-Fusion is a uniquely spun yarn with 125 meters to a ball. It is 50% bamboo and 50% cotton and is lovingly hand-dyed in South Africa.
