ABBREVIATIONS

2trtog – two treble together

ch/s – chain/s

dc – double crochet

fptr – front post treble

2fprrtog – two front post

trebles together

RS – right side

slst – slip stitch

st/s – stitch/es

tr – treble

WS – wrong side

IMPORTANT! PATTERN NOTES

- Pattern is written in UK terminology.
- Work ch3 at the beginning of tr rounds. This counts as a stitch.
- Work 1ch at the beginning of dc rounds. This does not count as a stitch.



SPECIAL STITCHES

Fptr: Yarn over and insert hook from front to back and front again around the post of the stitch indicated. Work tr as per normal.

2fprrtog: Yarn over and insert hook from front to back and front again around the post of the stitch indicated. Yarn over and pull through the loop,

yarn over and pull through next two loops. (Two loops remain on hook). Yarn over and insert hook from front to back and front again around the next indicated stitch. Yarn over and pull through loop. (4 loops on hook) (When the next stitch is a 2trtog, work around the body of the entire stitch) Yarn over, pull through two loops on hook, yarn over and pull through remaining 3 loops on hook.

STITCH PATTERN

Row 1: Insert hook in the 3rd ch from hook and work 1tr, 1tr in the next 5 chs, (2trtog over the next 2 chs) twice, 1tr in the next 5 chs, *3tr in the next ch, 1tr in the next 5 chs, (2trtog over the next 2 chs) twice, 1tr in the next 5 chs*, rep from * to last ch, 2tr in the last ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch3, 1tr at the base of the ch 3, 1tr in the next 5 sts, (2trtog over the next 2 sts) twice, 1tr in the next 5 sts, *3tr in the next st, 1tr in the next 5 sts, (2trtog over the next 2 sts) twice, 1tr in the next 5 sts*, rep from * to last st, 2tr in the last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch3, 1tr at the base of the ch 3, 1fprr around the next 5 sts, 2fprrtog around the next st and 2trtog, 2fprrtog around the next 2trtog and st, 1fprr around the next 5 sts, *3tr in the next st, 1fprr around the next 5 sts, 2fprrtog around the next st and 2trtog, 2fprrtog around the next 2trtog and st, 1fprrtog around the next 5 sts*, rep from * to last st, 2tr in the last st, turn.

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INSTRUCTIONS

(Make 2 identical panels)

With Eco-cotton Lime, and a 4.00mm hook, ch 213. *Refer to the stitch pattern and change colour as specified for each row.*

Row 1: Work row 1.

Row 2: Eco-Fusion Lime, work row 2.

Row 3: Eco-Fusion Emerald, work row 2.

Row 4: Eco-Fusion Willow, work row 2.

Row 5: Eco-Cotton Forest, work row 2.

Row 6: Eco-Fusion Forest, work row 2.

Row 7: Eco-Cotton Willow, work row 2.

Row 8: Eco-Cotton Emerald, work row 2.

Row 9: Eco-Cotton Lime, work row 2.

Row 10: Eco-Cotton Orchid, work row 3.

Row 11: Eco-Fusion Sweet Pea, work row 2.

Row 12: Eco-Fusion Ruby Red, work row 2.

Row 13: Eco-Fusion Pickled Ginger, work row 2.

Row 14: Eco-Fusion Sweet Pea, work row 2.

Row 15: Eco-Cotton Ruby Red, work row 2.

Row 16: Eco-Fusion Sunkissed Coral, work row 2.

Row 17: Eco-Cotton Sunkissed Coral, work row 2.

Row 18: Eco-Cotton Seashell, work row 2.

Row 19: Eco-Cotton Sunkissed Coral, work row 2.

Row 20: Eco-Fusion Bordeaux, work row 2.

Row 21: Eco-Cotton Bordeaux, work row 2.

Row 22: Eco-Fusion Lavender, work row 3.

Row 23: Eco-Cotton Violet, work row 2.

Row 24: Eco-Cotton Paris, work row 2.

Row 25: Eco-Fusion Violet, work row 2.

Row 26: Eco-Cotton Lavender, work row 2.

Row 27: Eco-Fusion Paris, work row 2.

Row 28: Eco-Cotton Denim, work row 3.

Row 29: Eco-Fusion Denim, work row 2.

Row 30: Eco-Cotton Aventurine, work row 2.

Row 31: Eco-Cotton Watershed, work row 2.

Row 32: Eco-Cotton Denim, work row 2.

Row 33: Eco-Fusion Aqua, work row 2.

Row 34: Eco-Fusion Aventurine, work row 2.

Row 35: Eco-Fusion Denim, work row 2.

Row 36: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 3.

Row 37 – 41: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 2.

Row 42: Eco-Cotton Willow, work row 3.

Row 43 – 47: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 2.

Row 48: Eco-Cotton Orchid, work row 3.

Row 49 – 53: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 2.

Row 54: Eco-Fusion Paris, work row 3.

Row 55 – 59: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 2.

Row 60: Eco-Cotton Aventurine, work row 3.

Row 61 – 65: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 2.

Row 66: Eco-Fusion Forest, work row 3.

Row 67 – 71: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 2.

Row 72: Eco-Cotton Sweet Pea, work row 3.

Row 73 – 77: Eco-Cotton Vanilla, work row 2.

FINISH UP

Weave in all loose ends. With wrong sides facing, sew together as follows:

The first two stitches. Skip the 'dips' of the stitch pattern and sew together the next 3tr. Rep across, skipping the dips every time. Sew the last two stitches together. Weave in all loose ends. The dips of both sides would have created a circular hole. With Eco-Cotton Bessy, work 1 round of dc around the 'dips'/circles. Weave in the last remaining ends. With Bessy, cut lengths of Bessy and add as tassels at both ends of the throw.

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ABOUT THE YARNS

Eco-Cotton is a softly spun yarn with 125 meters to a ball. It is 100% cotton and lovingly hand-dyed in South Africa.

Eco-Fusion is a uniquely spun yarn with 125 meters to a ball. It is 50% bamboo and 50% cotton & lovingly hand dyed in South Africa.
